INTRODUCTION

The Sundays after Epiphany began with Jesus' baptism and end with three disciples' vision of his transfiguration. In Mark's story of Jesus' baptism, apparently only Jesus sees the Spirit descending and hears the words from heaven. But now Jesus' three closest friends hear the same words naming him God's Beloved. As believers, Paul writes, we are enabled to see the

God-light in Jesus' face, because the same God who created light in the first place has shone in our hearts to give us that vision. The light of God's glory in Jesus has enlightened us through baptism and shines in us also for others to see.

FIRST READING: 2 Kings 2:1-12

A Our first reading is from 2 Kings, chapter 2, verses 1-12.

Today's reading centers on the transfer of power and authority from the prophet Elijah to Elisha. Their travels, which retrace the path of Joshua back to Moab (the place where Moses died) and the parting of the waters, demonstrate that Elisha and Elijah are legitimate successors of the great prophet Moses.

The reading begins:

¹Now when the LORD was about to take Elijah up to heaven by a whirlwind, Elijah and Elisha were on their way from Gilgal. ²Elijah said to Elisha, "Stay here; for the LORD has sent me as far as Bethel." But Elisha said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So they went down to Bethel. 3The company of prophets who were in Bethel came out to Elisha, and said to him, "Do you know that today the LORD will take your master away from you?" And he said, "Yes, I know; keep silent." ⁴Elijah said to him, "Elisha, stay here; for the LORD has sent me to Jericho." But he said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So they came to Jericho. 5The company of prophets who were at Jericho drew near to Elisha, and said to him, "Do you know that today the LORD will take your master away from you?" And he answered, "Yes, I know; be silent." 6Then Elijah said to him, "Stay here; for the LORD has sent me to the Jordan." But he said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So the two of them went on. ⁷Fifty men of the company of prophets also went, and stood at some distance from them, as they both were standing by the Jordan. 8Then Elijah took his mantle and rolled it up, and struck the water; the water was parted to the one side and to the other, until the two of them crossed on dry ground. 9When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "Tell me what I may do for you, before I am taken from you." Elisha said, "Please let me inherit a double share of your spirit." ¹⁰He responded, "You have asked a hard thing; yet, if you see me as I am being taken from you, it will be granted you; if not, it will not." 11As they continued walking and talking, a chariot of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them, and

Elijah ascended in a whirlwind into heaven. ¹²Elisha kept watching and crying out, "Father, father! The chariots of Israel and its horsemen!" But when he could no longer see him, he grasped his own clothes and tore them in two pieces.

PSALM: Psalm 50:1-6

A The Psalm today is from Psalm 50, verses 1-6. We will read the Psalm responsively. The congregation will please respond by reading the words in bold print.

¹The mighty one, God the LORD, has spoken; calling the earth from the rising of the sun to its setting.

²Out of Zion, perfect in its beauty, God shines forth in glory.

³Our God will come and will not keep silence; with a consuming flame before, and round about a raging storm.

⁵"Gather before me my loyal followers, those who have made a covenant with me and sealed it with sacrifice."

SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 4:3-6

A Our second reading is from 2 Corinthians, chapter 4, verses 3-6.

The spotlight of Christian ministry is not on the people who carry out ministry but on the Lord Jesus Christ. Just as God made light shine at creation, God makes the light of Jesus Christ shine in our lives through Christian ministry.

The reading begins:

³Even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. ⁴In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. ⁵For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. ⁶For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

Mark's gospel presents the transfiguration as a preview of what would become apparent to Jesus' followers after he rose from the dead. Confused disciples are given a vision of God's glory manifest in the beloved Son.

And he was transfigured before them, ³and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. ⁴And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. ⁵Then Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." ⁶He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. ⁷Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!" ⁸Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus. ⁹As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead.



UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS

Wednesday, February 14, 2024 Cyril, monk, died 869; Methodius, bishop, died 885; missionaries to the Slavs

These two brothers from Thessalonika, Greece, were monks and were sent to bring Christianity to the Slavic people. In the course of their work they created a written language, inventing the Cyrillic alphabet for it, and translated the Bible and the liturgy.

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SERVICE OVERVIEW: TRANSFIGURATION: AMAZING THEN AND NOW

The transfiguration is one of those ancient events that still puzzle us. What really happened to Jesus that day? Since we cannot go back to that time, we are left to speculate. We take stabs in the dark and make educated guesses, but at the end of the day we are left with a holy mystery to ponder.

Whatever happened that day, there is a timeless spiritual reality behind the physical details Mark gives us. God sometimes uses extreme and amazing methods to transform us when we open ourselves to the Holy Spirit. God's spirit transfigured Jesus then. That same Spirit is still transforming people today. We don't have to explain first-century miracles to trust that God's transforming Spirit is timeless and at work within each of us today. We do not have to understand everything to see the beauty of God at work in the world, continually transfiguring us into the people we were created to be.

THEOLOGICAL REFLECTION:

In our worship after Epiphany, we have seen Jesus show himself to be Christ - The One anointed by God to be our Savior. The Transfiguration concludes the time after Epiphany. Today, Jesus appears on a mountain in divine glory. Welcome to worship! Celebrate the mystery of Christ. In three days, on Ash Wednesday, we begin the climb to the mountain of Jesus' crucifixion. As the church, we hold side by side the glory of God *and* the cross of Jesus. This time after Epiphany began with a star illuminating the way to discover the Messiah, and now ends with the light shining from Jesus himself into our lives.

Imagine what would happen if someone from the days of Jesus were suddenly transported to our present. How would someone accustomed to walking everywhere respond to driving in a car at top speed or flying in a jet? How would someone who spends their life depending on oil lamps for light respond to electric lights? It is fun to muse at how people might respond, as we reflect on how sophisticated we are.

Now imagine if the scene were reversed. How would someone accustomed to understanding much in the world around them respond to an event as otherworldly as the transfiguration? We understand volcanoes and the northern lights. We can explain lightning and thunder. We know about germs and disease transmission. So what would we do when confronted with something so amazing, awesome, and unexplainable? The disciples find themselves standing in the presence of their great prophets, Elijah and Moses, while watching Jesus be transfigured. It must have been so overwhelming! Peter awkwardly suggests they build tents or dwellings. They want to bask in this majestic moment. Have you ever experienced a faith moment that put you in such awe that you didn't know what to do?

The word translated in English as "transform" or "transfigure" in the gospels is the Greek verb *metamorphoó*. It's the root of the English word *metamorphosis*. The first metamorphosis we often learn about is often a caterpillar changing into a butterfly. Now, we follow the metamorphosis life cycle of Jesus through the gospels and see him changed in dazzling light as God reveals God's own divinity within Jesus. This is a turning point for Jesus as he turns toward Jerusalem, toward his death and resurrection. This is his ultimate transfiguration that paves the way for *us* to be metamorphosed by God, to be made new in Christ.

KID STUDY:

Jesus went up on a mountain, and He took a few of his closest friends: Peter, James, and John. When they were up there, Jesus suddenly transformed in front of them and began shining like the sun, all full of light! It made the disciples pretty scared. Then they saw Moses and Elijah, prophets who had died. They didn't know what to do! Then, as if they were not surprised or scared enough, they heard God's voice announce "this is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased - listen to Him!"

Jesus comforted and encouraged them to overcome their fear. The disciples had caught a peek of who Christ was. Like us, it was hard to understand that Jesus was a human, but also God at the same time. When Jesus came to Earth, it was sort of like he was God in disguise. Many people had been waiting for a Messiah and wondered what that person would be like. The disciples had wondered if Jesus was the one they had long awaited. They thought he was, but they weren't totally sure. This experience on the mountain took away any possible doubt! Seeing Jesus transformed, in a way, and hearing God's voice made them absolutely certain of who they were following. This was really and truly God.

INDIVIDUAL REFLECTION:

Christ brings before the disciples the one who had died and the one who had not yet died. Both had lost their life, and had found it. Both had courageously withstood a tyrant: one the Egyptian, the other Arab. Both were simple, unlearned men. One was slow of speech and weak of voice, the other a rough countryman. And both were men who had despised the riches of this world. For Moses possessed nothing, and Elijah had nothing but his sheepskin. Christ brought these men before the disciples, for he wished them to imitate their courage of soul and their steadfastness in leading their people, so that they might be as gentle as Moses, possessed of the zeal of Elijah, and as devoted as both were. He brought these men before them in glory, that
