FIRST READING: Acts 9:36-43

A Our first reading is from Acts, chapter 9, verses 36-43.

Dorcas was a faithful and devoted woman of charity in the community of Joppa. Her kindness and her work with clothing were well-known, especially to the widows in town. When she fell ill and died, Peter raised her back to life through the power of prayer.

The reading begins:

³⁶Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. ³⁷At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. ³⁸Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, "Please come to us without delay." ³⁹So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. ⁴⁰Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, "Tabitha, get up." Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. ⁴¹He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. ⁴²This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. ⁴³Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

SECOND READING: Revelation 7:9-17

⁹After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. ¹⁰They cried out in a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!" ¹¹And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, ¹²singing, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen." ¹³Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?" ¹⁴I said to him, "Sir, you are the one that knows." Then he said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. ¹⁵For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. ¹⁶They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; ¹⁷for the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS

Sunday, May 8, 2022 Julian of Norwich, renewer of the church, died around 1416
When she was about thirty years old, Julian (or Juliana) reported visions that she later compiled

into a book, *Sixteen Revelations of Divine Love*, now a classic of medieval mysticism. The visions declared that love was the meaning of religious experience, provided by Christ who is love, for the purpose of love.

Sunday, May 8, 2022 Victor the Moor, martyr, died 303 (TFF)

Also known as Victor Maurus, this native of the northwest African nation of Mauritania was a soldier in the Roman Praetorian Guard. Under the persecution of Maximian, Victor died for his faith at Milan.

Monday, May 9, 2022 Nicolaus Ludwig von Zinzendorf, renewer of the church, hymnwriter, died 1760

When he was 22, a group of Moravians asked permission to live on Zinzendorf's land. He agreed, and eventually worldwide Moravian missions emanated from this community. Zinzendorf participated in these missions, and is also remembered for writing hymns characteristic of his Pietistic faith.

Saturday, May 14, 2022 Matthias, Apostle

Matthias was the apostle added to the Twelve after Jesus' resurrection, as a replacement for the dead Judas Iscariot. He had traveled among the followers of Jesus throughout the Lord's ministry. Formerly commemorated on February 24, Matthias's celebration is moved to May 14 in agreement with most Western calendars.

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SERVICE OVERVIEW: THE SEARCHING SHEEP

Messages and information today are texted, tweeted, broadcast, e-mailed, phoned, lectured, announced, packaged, and repackaged. The means and avenues for communication are many. Yet when it comes to the person known as Jesus of Nazareth we are often left standing in the place of the Jewish people who gathered around Jesus at that portico in today's gospel reading. We long to know. Who are you, Jesus? What are you really about? Tell us plainly. As the church we have grown accustomed to the idea of Jesus seeking out the lost sheep and bringing them safely home, and of him knowing the sheep by name. Today's texts are rich in reframing *who* is searching for *whom*. Who is seeking after Jesus, and to what does that seeking lead? Still, will we be satisfied with any answer? The faith of Tabitha and the miracle-working Peter, the vision of saints and mythical beasts, and even Jesus' works point to one who is in and of God. Yet we wonder if it can't be spelled out for us more clearly. In this season of proclaiming a Christ who breaks the powers of death and whose realm is one of glory, we open ourselves to questions of exactly who this Jesus is. We see answers coming to life in story, miracles, and testimony. Today is an opportunity for us in weakness and glory, in doubt and in faith, in simplicity and awe, to seek and embrace the one who is already in our midst.

THEOLOGICAL REFLECTION:

It is the fourth week of Easter, and today we celebrate Jesus the Good Shepherd. Shepherding was a difficult and dirty job for the men and women who herded the flocks, but sheep were gifts

from God and essential sources of life for the people. Welcome to worship! Join us in thanks as Christ shepherds his flock of sheep given to him by God.

Many people have little or no firsthand understanding of a shepherd's day-to-day work, but the image of Christ the Good Shepherd as a strong and caring protector continues to resonate. Being known by name, being protected when dangers come, and being cared for by someone who really knows us are powerful images of human needs. The Christian life begins in baptism when God claims us. Throughout the journey of life God cares for us, bringing rest and comfort. We are protected along the way, and even when the worst happens the promise of God's presence sustains. Along the way, we are fed and nourished. Finally, at the last, God's people are promised a place Jesus himself has prepared. Life and death, joy and sorrow, fear and courage; all accompanied by the promises of God.

Jesus responds to people who have seen his works and still do not believe by saying, "My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me." Here Jesus suggests faith comes to us as a gift from God. How blessed are those who believe! At the same time, there are plenty of times in life when even the faithful do not hear the voice of Jesus. Sometimes the noise of the world drowns out the voice of Jesus. Sometimes we choose not to listen for the shepherd's voice, and sometimes we hear with complete clarity.

The Jews gathered around Jesus and said to him, "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly." To anyone familiar with the gospels, "Tell us plainly" reads like the punch line to a joke. Jesus speaks in parables that people cannot understand. Jesus speaks cryptically, especially in John's gospel. Jesus often answers a question with a question. It would be so much easier if Jesus would tell us plainly. It would be so much easier if the truth of the gospel, the promise of resurrected life, the promise of the kingdom of God breaking into the world, were easily proven and verifiable. Would that we could know this truth like we know the earth orbits the sun. Instead we are left with faith, trust, and hope. We don't have certainty; we have confidence. We don't have an iron clad guarantee; we have a promise. We don't have a signed contract; we have hope, which we trust does not disappoint.

KID STUDY:

One day, some people asked Jesus to tell them plainly if he was the Christ. He answered them saying, "I told you, but you did not believe me because you are not my sheep. My sheep listen to my voice and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand." When you give your heart to Jesus and place your life in his hands, you have his promise that you are safe and that nothing can snatch you from his hand. Oh, you may have your "ups and downs." You may even stray away at times, but just a little tug will pull you right back into His hand. Even if you really mess up, Jesus will you up and place you right back where you belong -- in the palm of his hand. What a wonderful promise! Jesus has you in the palm of his hand.

INDIVIDUAL REFLECTION:

Hear and understand God’s voice, in Jesus, finding us when we need it most. It’s a voice that knows our story in all of its fullness: the sinful and the saintly, the broken and the beautiful, the flawed and faithful. Once we’ve followed the sound of that voice; once we’ve heard that kind of grace and mercy and forgiveness and love for ourselves and believed it, we can become and we can be that voice for others. Then we will walk, together with more of God’s children, along paths and into pastures of abundant life. - Mark Havel
