FIRST READING: Daniel 7:1-3, 15-18

A Our first reading is from Daniel, chapter 7, verses 1-3 and 15-18.

The book of Daniel was written in the second century BCE, when the Syrian king Antiochus Epiphanes was severely persecuting the Jews. Daniel's vision of the four beasts proclaims that human kings will come and go, but the kingdom will ultimately belong to God and to God's people.

The reading begins:

¹In the first year of King Belshazzar of Babylon, Daniel had a dream and visions of his head as he lay in bed. Then he wrote down the dream: ²I, Daniel, saw in my vision by night the four winds of heaven stirring up the great sea, ³and four great beasts came up out of the sea, different from one another. ¹⁵As for me, Daniel, my spirit was troubled within me, and the visions of my head terrified me. ¹⁶I approached one of the attendants to ask him the truth concerning all this. So he said that he would disclose to me the interpretation of the matter: ¹⁷"As for these four great beasts, four kings shall arise out of the earth. ¹⁸But the holy ones of the Most High shall receive the kingdom and possess the kingdom forever — forever and ever."

SECOND READING: Ephesians 1:11-23

A Our second reading is from Ephesians, chapter 1, verses 11-23.

After giving thanks for the faith of the Ephesians, the writer of this letter prays that they might understand the wisdom, hope, and power of God that is embodied in Jesus Christ.

The reading begins:

¹¹In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, ¹²so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. ¹³In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; ¹⁴this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory. ¹⁵I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason ¹⁶I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. ¹⁷I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, ¹⁸so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, ¹⁹and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. ²⁰God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, ²¹far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. ²²And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, ²³which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS

Monday, November 7, 2022 **John Christian Frederick Heyer, died 1873; Bartholomaeus Ziegenbalg, died 1719; Ludwig Nommensen, died 1918; missionaries**

Heyer was the first missionary sent out by American Lutherans. After teaching at Gettysburg College and Seminary he was assigned to the Andhra region of India. A worker among the Tamil people on the southeast coast of India, Ziegenbalg was opposed both by local Hindus and by Danish authorities who favored a different missionary style. He was known for caring about the welfare of the whole person. Nommensen was born in northern Germany and was sent to Sumatra as a Lutheran missionary. Working among the Batak people, he translated the scriptures into their language, and honored their native culture.

Friday, November 11, 2022 **Martin, Bishop of Tours, died 397**

Martin's pagan father enlisted him in the Roman army. Approached by a beggar, Martin cut his cloak in half and gave part to the man, whom he later understood as representing Christ. He asked to leave the army, but was jailed instead. After his release, he became a preacher, and later a bishop.

Friday, November 11, 2022 **Søren Aabye Kierkegaard, teacher, died 1855**

Kierkegaard was a Danish theologian whose writings also gave rise to the modern philosophy of existentialism. He frequently attacked the complacency of the state church of his day, as well as its desire to be accepted by polite society rather than be a stumbling block.

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SERVICE OVERVIEW: *WHOLLY SAINTS*

Who are the saints, and what do they have to say to us? Rather than being perfect Christians, the saints are people who have been made whole by the grace of God, through baptism into Christ. The communion of saints is a diverse array of witnesses who remind us of God's continuing faithfulness, past, present, and future. In the picture painted by the gospel reading from Luke, the saints challenge us to embody the surprising, world-reversing ways of the reign of God.

THEOLOGICAL REFLECTION:

Today is the festival of All Saints. God has made into saints all who have been baptized into Christ, and we honor especially those saints who have died in the faith. Their names may be unknown and their lives generally forgotten, but we sing our thanks that they are now held in God. Welcome to worship! Be surrounded by the cloud of witnesses and be surrounded by God's love.

What makes someone a saint? Saints are not just people from the past. Saints are people from the present. People we see every day. Some we have never met in person. They inspire us to be closer and more faithful to God in the way we live, serve, and pray. This is because saints are ordinary people (just like us) who with God's help, live in an extraordinary way. By the grace of God given in our baptism and experienced in the holy people around us, we can all become saints.

The dichotomy of blessings and woes in the gospel reading should give us pause before labeling anyone or any situation as singularly positive or negative. We are generally way too quick to attach a judgment to one side over its opposite. Remember, Luther reminds us that we are all simultaneously sinners and saints. As we lift up all of the baptized saints today, we are encouraged to lean into the saint in each of us. Even during the most difficult times, we are assured that we are blessed because we know Jesus will find us. We celebrate the power of God's grace to make holy even lost sinners like you and me.

Luke writes, "Blessed are you who are poor." Who is "poor"? We are all in some way poor, in body or in spirit, and we ask for God's blessings. But spiritualizing the phrase ought not lead us to forget Paul's original meaning to the Galatians: there are people who are desperately poor, hungry, and dispossessed. The gospel reading reminds us of the blessedness of those who are poor, hungry, and excluded. As Christians, we are to serve them. We are the body of Christ, offering literal food AND spiritual food to the poor.

KID STUDY:

Today we are celebrating "All Saints' Day." Do you know any saints? What makes a person a saint? Believe it or not, YOU are a saint. A saint is anyone who responds to the love of God. Anyone who knows God and who decides to love God back is a saint. In the Bible, no one person is ever called a saint. The word, when it occurs, is always *plural*, or more than one. That means we cannot be a saint on our own. We are meant to be together. We are meant to work together. We are Jesus's hands and feet, and we serve with each other to care for and to

surround people with God's love. Today is *God's Work, Our Hands* Day and we will put our faith into action with service projects that honor all of God's people. Remember that service is not just for one day, though. We should honor God and share God's love every day through service.

INDIVIDUAL REFLECTION:

Today is All Saints, and not just Some Saints. We don't need special saints to intercede for us because God listens to them more since they were just basically better Christians than we are. What we celebrate when we celebrate All Saints is not the superhuman faith and power of a select few, but God's ability to use flawed people to do divine things. We celebrate all on whom God has acted in baptism, sealing them, as Ephesians says, with the mark of the promised Holy Spirit. We celebrate the fact that God creates faith in God's people, and those people through ordinary acts of love, bring the Kingdom of Heaven closer to Earth. We celebrate that we have, in all who've gone before us, what St Paul calls "such a great cloud of witnesses" and that the faithful departed are as much the body of Christ as we are. -Nadia Bolz-Weber
