A Our first reading is from Isaiah, chapter 9, verses 2-7.

This poem promises deliverance from Assyrian oppression, a hope based on the birth of a royal child with a name full of promise. While Judah's king will practice justice and righteousness, the real basis for faith lies in God's passion for the people: The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this!

²The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness — on them light has shined. ³You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. ⁴For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. ⁵For all the boots of the tramping warriors and all the garments rolled in blood shall be burned as fuel for the fire. ⁶For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. ⁷His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onward and forevermore. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this.

A Our second reading is from Titus, chapter 2, verses 11-14.


OFFERING and POWER OF ONE

UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS

Tuesday, December 26, 2023 Stephen, Deacon and Martyr

Stephen was a deacon and the first martyr of the church. He was one of those seven upon whom the apostles laid hands after they had been chosen to serve widows and others in need. Later, Stephen's preaching angered the temple authorities, and they ordered him to be put to death by stoning.

Wednesday, December 27, 2023 John, Apostle and Evangelist

The son of Zebedee and brother of James, John was one of the twelve disciples and witness to the transfiguration. Tradition has named him also the writer of the Gospel of John, the three New Testament letters bearing his name, as well as Revelation.

Thursday, December 28, 2023 The Holy Innocents, Martyrs

This day commemorates the young children killed by Herod in Bethlehem in his jealous attempt to murder the baby Jesus, a sobering reminder of the evil that led Christ to be born for our salvation.

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SERVICE OVERVIEW: HOPE IS BORN INTO THE WORLD

Dress up. Decorate. TV specials, concerts, parties. Spend money. There is a sense that Christmas is the time to feel good, do good, and perhaps live a little better than the rest of the year. Even the most cynical get swept up in the idea that our lives and the world around us shine a little brighter - a sugar-coated holiday rush only to be met days later by an emotional crash. Yet these signs point to a deep-seated hope that is lodged in the hearts and minds of those moving into this season. There is a longing and fervent hope that God will enter in to lessen our worldly challenges. To this longing and fervent hope, we look to the One who claims and engages us in a central story of hope and promise.

THEOLOGICAL REFLECTION:

On Christmas Eve we celebrate God being born on earth as a poor Jewish child, whom we call Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace. The darkness of the night recalls Calvary, and the candles we light anticipate the candles of Easter, for this infant was born to die and rise for us. Welcome to worship! Join the angels and sing, "Glory to God!" Wrapped in every breath and action is God's direct connection with the earth and its people. This night contrasts with voices and theologies that view God as distant and unengaged with humanity and the world. From old, the promise of God drawing near has been uttered; in the gospel we witness the birth of God's presence through a teenage girl; throughout we are invited to join the song of creation, hope, and salvation. Tonight we pulse with the exhilaration of Mary and the shepherds, and all who live at the margins, as we experience and proclaim that God dwells with us! While people may often talk of the "magic" of Christmas, it is our call to speak to the *incarnation* (embodied in flesh) of Christmas. As we gather together to hear the familiar story, our blessing and challenge is to witness again to God's promise and promise-keeping with vitality and to join the chorus of joy in what God has done and continues to do in being made real among us.

Into the lights and presents, the music and gatherings, even the wars, poverty, little empires, and tumult of the world, God meets and claims us in that spirit of hope. Christmas Eve worship becomes another occasion for us as the church to speak the truth of heartache and pain. The tinsel and the lights of the season cannot distract from the lamentations welling up in the world. Into real human suffering, God erupted the Bethlehem night with divine messengers as the shepherds witnessed the proclaimed promise of Christ's birth.

Christ is born to release us from oppression, to interrupt abusive habits. The Prince of peace has come to train us in ways of being people of God for all the living beings with whom we share this planet. Christmas is a time to behold what has appeared and to anticipate the glory of God's

fuller appearance that shines in all of creation. No matter how much destruction we witness, we wait and work with this vision of God's grace made manifest. God calls us to dream and live into a new reality as we encounter this babe at Bethlehem and find this Christ-child born in our lives again. Christmas speaks to our greatest longing, and turns our desperation and sadness to carols of joy. Luke's gospel account invites us to join the song of the angels and sing out the Savior's birth.

KID STUDY:

We talk a lot about light and darkness at Christmastime. What are lights you regularly see? Flashlights and headlights of cars cast a bright light, but make it nearly impossible to see anything outside of their beam. The same is true for a phone or a tablet in a dark room. It is difficult to focus on anything outside of that screen. A night light or candle, though, casts a much dimmer light but brightens the entire space. God's arrival as a baby in a stable is like this. The birth of Jesus was not bright or flashy, and happened alongside the darkness of the night which is equally important! The Bible tells us that "those who live in darkness have seen a great light." Jesus is that light... the Light Of The World!

INDIVIDUAL REFLECTION:

It is no use saying that we are born two thousand years too late to give room to Christ. Christ is always with us, always asking for room in our hearts. But now it is with the voice of our contemporaries that he speaks, with the eyes of store clerks, factory workers, and children that he gazes; with the hand of office workers, slum dwellers, and suburban housewives that he gives. It is with the feet of soldiers and tramps that he walks, and with the heart of anyone in need that longs for shelter. It would be foolish to pretend that it is always easy to remember this. If everyone were holy and handsome, with "alter Christus" shining in neon lighting from them, it would be easy to see Christ in everyone. But that was not Christ's way for himself, now when he is disguised under every type of humanity that treads the earth. It is not because these people remind us of Christ, but because they are Christ, asking us to find room for him, exactly as he did at the first Christmas. - Dorothy Day [Dorothy Day, By Little and By Little, ed.
